The Institute's three campuses in Ookayama, Suzukakedai and Tamachi are home to 1,150 faculty members and approximately 10,000 students (around 4,800 undergraduates, 5,100 postgraduates and 100 research students) in 6 Schools and 19 Departments. International students comprise nearly 13% of the student body.

Visa Status/ Procedures to obtain a student visa	<procedures a="" obtain="" student="" to="" visa=""> <ol> <li>After the application, the staff of the International Student Exchange Division apply for the student's COE (Certificate of Eligibility), which is documentation used for obtaining a visa to study in Japan.</li> <li>The Immigration Bureau in Tokyo issues the COE and sends it to Tokyo Tech.</li> <li>The staff of Tokyo Tech send the COE to a student exchange officer of the student's home university.</li> </ol></procedures>
	4) After the COE is handed to the student, he/she must use it to apply for a "student" visa at the Japanese Embassy/ Consulate in his/her home country .

The exact cost varies by the municipal office where the student is registered.
