

La Trobe University subject selection guide for Exchange and Study abroad programs

Full time study requirement

The standard full time study load for undergraduate students at La Trobe is 60 credit points per semester. The majority of subjects on offer at La Trobe are worth 15 credit points.

It is recommended that you list at least 8 subjects on your application to La Trobe so that there is flexibility with assessment and enrolment.


Finding Subjects

There are a few ways that students may like to search for subjects.

- By using the <u>La Trobe Handbook</u>. You can find details about each for the degree programs and what subjects belong to each area of study.
- Subject Search Database: <u>http://www.latrobe.edu.au/students/subjects</u>students can search for individual subjects, and get more specific information about the subject's contents.

More detailed information (subject syllabi) about the subjects will **only** be available in the first week of classes once enrolled into the class.

Once you enter the Subject Search Database, the following screen will come up:



The subject database allows one to filter by semester dates and campus location, as well as level of study and Exchange/Study Abroad available classes.

Campus and Semester Availability

Once you have navigated your way to a subject page you should click on subject particulars to view the pre-requisites see what type/s of subjects you will need to have already completed at your home university in order to gain approval for the subject.

<u>We recommend that students list about 8 subjects on their applications</u>, so that there is more flexibility when it comes time to enrol, just in case there are any timetable clashes etc. You will not be able to renegotiate subjects after an Offer Letter has been issued. It will be possible to do so at the time of enrolment directly in consultation with the faculty <u>on the enrolment day during orientation</u>.

The majority of our subjects are offered over a semester period. **LTU Semester 1** = February to June **LTU Semester 2** = July to November

The individual subject description is in the section under "Subject Outline" (please see picture below). Students also need to watch when they open a subject description that immediately next to the Subject code it doesn't have wording like "not available".

Subject year level will be indicted by the numeric in the middle of the subject code. Codes that contain **<u>"1, 2 or 3" are for Undergraduate students</u>** and those that contain either a <u>"4" or "5" are for</u> <u>postgraduate students</u> (e.g. ABC4ABC).

Business majors – primary majors	
Following are majors that may be attached to the Bachelor of Business, the Bachelor of Business (Accounting), and the Bachelor of Accounting.	
By definition the major must be 120 Credit Points and will include no more than 30 Credit Points at first-year level; 30 or more Credit Points at second-year level; and 45 or more Credit Points at third-year level to fulfil the requirements of the major. Note that not all majors are available on all campuses.	
Where a student wishes to take an approved subject relevant to the major, approval must be given by the Head of Department or his/her delegate.	
Where a subject appears as both a core in their course and a chosen second major or minor, an approved substitute subject must be taken to complete the second major or minor.
