Shortage Studies: Interdisciplinary Approaches to the Deficiencies in Social, Cultural, and Natural Contexts

University of Opole, Opole, Poland - 9 April 2019

After the age of extremes (Hobsbawm, 1994) and the prosperity of the Core at the cost of the Peripheries (Wallerstein, 2004), the world is probably drifting inevitably towards the times of deficiencies. The anthropocene accelerates towards a severe intervention into the biodiversity, ecology and climate. Also the human societies and cultures, together with spaces and spheres of communication seem to undergo a similar dynamic. The saturation and acceleration leads to acute limitation. We introduce the perspective of deficiencies to talk about the problems of contemporary world. Shortage studies are interdisciplinary and inclusive, although we seek papers devoted to the consequences of human activity. This interdisciplinary conference is devoted but not limited to the following topics:

- shrinking public sphere (democracy)
- truth/information (as opposed to fake news, misinformation, manipulation)
- attention (as opposed to streams of content and information overload)
- ethnocentrism (as opposed to human universalism, European identity, human rights, interculturalism)
- science-public gap or evidence based policy (as opposed to emotion and political marketing driven policies)
- privacy (as opposed to surveillance, skewed life-work balance)
- work (as opposed to unemployment, automation and AI)
- equality in class, gender, race and ethnicity (as opposed to solidarity and equality)
- ecological sustainability and biodiversity (as opposed to pollution, warming, and exploitation)
- urban public spaces (as opposed to gentrification and commercialization of space)
- academic freedom (as opposed to predatory publishing, neoliberal ranking, and academic bureaucracy)

Students and PhD candidates who would like to share their research projects and discuss them with experts are welcome to join the conference panel for students held on 10 April 2019.

To take part please register through an <u>online form</u> and include the topic of your proposed presentation with a short abstract by **20 March 2019**. Papers accepted for the conference should be 15 minutes long.

Selected conference papers will be published a volume of an interdisciplinary academic journal.
