AWARD DETAILS

The scholarship may include a cost of living allowance and tuition reduction in various proportions. The scholarship may include a living allowance of CHF 20,000 a year and a tuition reduction calculated according to the financial situation.

HOW TO APPLY

Candidates should complete the regular online application for admission, including the general scholarship application pages. Admitted candidates, whose profile match the specific eligibility criteria for this scholarship, will automatically be considered. Applicants are not required to contact Universitas Gadjah Mada.
