



English Language Requirements

In order to undertake an exchange programme at the University of Birmingham, Study Abroad and Exchange students will need to demonstrate a suitable level of English proficiency.

To assess the student's English language level we will look at the following:

1. Nationals from EU / EEA and Switzerland

- For students from our European partners who do not need a VISA to come to the UK, we will consider the English level achieved by the student at the end of his/her secondary education as long as the qualification is listed in the Country Specific Table below.
- <u>COUNTRY SPECIFIC QUALIFICATIONS ACCEPTED AS PROOF OF ENGLISH LEVEL:</u>

Only qualifications listed in the Country Specific Table are accepted as sufficient proof of the required level of English.

- Should the country or qualification not be listed in the Country Specific Table above, or the student not have the required English grade, we can also accept an official certificate produced by the home institution. The B2 Certificate must be signed by the student's academic tutor, certifying that the student's standard of English is equivalent to the minimum of the B2 level based on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. It must be produced on the home institution's letterhead and uploaded together with the application. The B2 certificate is acceptable for nationals from EU / EEA and Switzerland only.
- Students who do not fall under any of the above categories must provide an <u>Approved</u> <u>English test</u> (e.g. IELTS or TOEFL). Details of all accepted qualifications are available at <u>https://www.birmingham.ac.uk/undergraduate/requirements/international/index.aspx</u>
- No proof of English language proficiency is required from Irish nationals.
- As part of the nomination process, the institution will confirm the English level of the student on the nomination form.

2. Non-EU nationals (except EEA countries and Switzerland)

If the nationality of the student is from a recognised <u>English Speaking Country (as defined</u> <u>by the UKVI)</u>, no proof of English language proficiency is required.
 Canadian Nationals are an exception: although Canada is not listed as an English Speaking Country by the UKVI, we do not need a proof of English unless the student is taught in French. In this case a high school certificate should be submitted to demonstrate the student's English language proficiency.

- Singapore nationals are an exception: although English is widely spoken in Singapore, it is
 not listed as an English Speaking Country by the UKVI. This means we do need a proof of
 English from the students' but this can be their O Level, A Level or Integrated Programme
 certificate from the student's pre-university education to demonstrate the student's English
 language proficiency.
- If the nationality of the student is from a country outside the UKVI list, the student must provide an <u>Approved English test</u> (e.g. IELTS or TOEFL). - If the nationality of the student is from a country outside the UKVI list but they are studying at a partner university in a recognised <u>English Speaking Country (as defined by the</u> <u>UKVI)</u>, excluding students taught in French in Canada then the below applies:
 - a student that is applying for a full year placement and will apply for a TIER 4 visa, will need to prove their English language proficiency by providing an acceptable qualification listed here:

 - a student that is applying for a one semester placement and will be on a Short Term Study Visa, will not need to prove their English language proficiency.
