Nomination and Application Process

NOMINATION PROCESS

Please fill out the online nomination form (link will be emailed to partners separately) and send the following nomination materials via email to Ms. Takahashi-Ede:

- Official English proficiency test score report (if not a native English speaker)
- Official university transcript(s) translated into English (Transcripts must include a grading scale.)

APPLICATION PROCESS

After we receive the online nomination form and nomination materials from partner universities, our online application link and the step-by-step application guide will be sent to each nominated student via email.

Application materials to be uploaded to the online application by applicants:

- Cover letter completed and signed by student's home university coordinator (A form will be provided to your student with the online application information.)
- Proof of finances (The minimum amount of proof of finances required is stated in the online application guide for students.)
- Copy of passport (Passport must be valid for a minimum of 6 months after the end of student's last semester at WMU. The signature should be visible on the passport ID page.)
- Copy of university transcript in English
- Copy of English proficiency test score report

Course Information

Courses Available for Exchange and American University Experience Students

Exchange and American University Experience students are eligible to take courses in all programs at Western Michigan University contingent on the student having completed the appropriate prerequisites, having acquired the appropriate level of English-language proficiency, and having submitted all paperwork prior to deadlines.

Credits Required for Exchange and American University Experience Students

- Undergraduate students may take 12 to 15 credit hours per semester. A minimum of 12 credit hours is needed to maintain visa status.
- Graduate students may take six to nine credit hours per semester. A minimum of 6 credit hours is needed to maintain visa status.

Course Registration Procedure

Students will be contacted by our office regarding their course selection and course in-progress forms after they complete their online application. WMU academic advisors will process course registration for incoming exchange and American University Experience students based on their course selection, course availability, and eligibility.

Academic Transcripts

Students will need to request and send their official transcript to their home institution after grades have posted. Due to U.S. privacy law (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act), We cannot send the transcript on the student's behalf. Health Insurance Requirements

Health Insurance

All international students must have health insurance coverage in effect on the first day of classes. The University cannot purchase health insurance on the student's behalf and apply the cost to their student account.

• J-Visa Holders Insurance Requirements

 Students entering the United States on a J-Visa must have health insurance that meets the minimum requirements set by U.S.
 Department of State regulations:

Other International Students Not on J-Visa

Health insurance for all other international students must meet the same requirements as the J-Visa holders, plus:

- Inpatient and outpatient medical coverage for hospitalization, emergency room, urgent care, maternity, physical therapy, and mental health services.
- Prescription (medication) coverage.
- Pre-existing condition clause not greater than 6 months.
- The insurance policy must be written in English, in U.S. currency, and have a U.S. billing address and phone number.

Tuberculosis Testing Requirement

Beginning Jan. 2020, incoming students from countries identified by the CDC as high-risk for tuberculosis exposure will be required to have testing done at WMU's health center. Sindecuse Health Center only offers the highly-reliable Quantiferon Gold test for M. tuberculosis exposure. A <u>worksheet</u> is used to determine risk level, and includes a list of affected countries.
