Ryuta USHIKUBO

Toyo University Center for Global Education and Exchange (Associate Professor)

Prof. Ushikubo graduated from Dokkyo University. He learned Japanese language education in the doctoral program at Waseda university and got a PhD (Japanese Language Education). He worked as a deputy chief instructor at an overseas educational institution (Waseda Education Thailand). After returning to Japan, he kept pursuing a career in language education, working as a research assistant at Waseda University and a lecturer at the Kwansei Gakuin University. He is currently teaching Japanese at the Center for Global Education and Exchange, Toyo University. His specialty is qualitative data analysis, teacher research, and classroom research.



Yusuke TANAKA

Aoyama Gakuin University (Associate Professor)

Graduated from the Japanese Language and Culture Course at the University of Tsukuba. Completed the doctoral program at Waseda University Graduate School and holds a Ph.D in Japanese Language Education. After working as a JSPS Research Fellowship for Young Scientists, a lecturer at Fudan University in China, an assistant at Waseda University, a lecturer and an associate professor at Toyo University, his current position is Associate Professor of Aoyama Gakuin University. His research topics include teaching Japanese to foreign students and non-native minors, analysis of Japanese teaching materials, language policy, history of Japanese language education, Business Japanese, introducing Japanese culture abroad, etc. Doctor Tanaka is the winner of numerous awards, including the 32nd Masayoshi Ohira Memorial Prize, the Prize for 2018 if the Society for Teaching Japanese as a Second Language, Waseda University Teaching Award (President' s Award) in 2017, the University of Tokyo Good Practice for Teaching Online President's Award in 2020, and the 1st SDGs Iwasa Prize for 2022, etc.

Toyo University Center for Global Education and Exchange (Lecturer)

Graduate of the Japanese Language Program at the College of Foreign Languages of the Ocean University of China. Completed the doctoral program at the Graduate School of Humanities, Kobe University. Assistant at the University of Hamburg (Germany) and Kobe University. Part-time and full-time Lecturer at Kobe Design University and Japan University of Economics. Currently a Lecturer at Toyo University. Doctor Chen's research covers modern Japanese grammar, Japanese language education, Japanese linguistics, as well as corpus linguistics. Takes special interest in sentence-final markers and Chinese-related lexicon in modern Japanese. Building on her theoretical knowledge of Japanese grammar and vocabulary, as well as her own learning experience, the lecturer will offer hints how to improve your Japanese skills.



Kiyomi NAGASAKI

NPO Research Institute for Japanese Language Education (Director • Researcher)

Part-time lecturer at Komazawa University and Tokyo Institute of Technology. After working for a steel manufacturer, she started teaching Japanese in 1992. After teaching at local Japanese language classes and schools(Japanese language school, vocational school, and university), she was posted to Kenya as a Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteer (JOCV) and experienced working in a cross-cultural environment. After returning to Japan, she has been involved in work related to the Japanese language and foreigners, such as Japanese language teacher training courses and teaching material development. Currently, she focuses on coordinating Japanese language training for business people at companies, supporting foreign students in their job hunting activities, and training business Japanese language teachers.
