AGU will conduct a Japanese placement test before students' arrival. Based on the placement test result, the level of the class will be determined.</u> 2) <u>A certain level of Japanese proficiency (Japanese CEFR--A1 Level or equivalent) is required to register for credit-earning Japanese language courses.</u> 3) <u>Non-credit-earning Japanese language courses for beginners taught in English is are offered at the Aoyama Campus (free of charge).</u></p>

<p>Course Restrictions for Exchange Students</p>	<p>Physical Education classes, Teacher's Certificate courses, Foreign Language courses for Japanese students, some courses offered by the Department of Education, and courses that are not open to the exchange students</p>
<p>Nomination of a Graduate Student</p>	<p>If a student wants to enroll in one of AGU's Master's Program, they must belong to a graduate school at the time of application. Graduate students may be accepted on a limited basis subject to approval from the graduate school based on the student's academic objectives. Please get in touch with the International Center before nominating a graduate student.</p> <p>Some Graduate Schools require a high level of Japanese language proficiency (JLPT N1 level). A few, such as International Politics, Economics & Communication, Aoyama Business School (MBA), and the Graduate School of Business, do not.</p> <p>NOTE: Graduate students of our partner institutions can belong to AGU's undergraduate program. However, they can only take courses for undergraduate students and are NOT allowed to take courses for graduate students in this case.</p>

<p>Course Registration</p>	<p>Register online during the registration period after attending the course registration orientation upon arrival.</p>

<p>Required G.P.A</p>	<p>G.P.A. 2.5 (4.0 scale) or above</p> <p>NOTE: If G.P.A. is not on a 4.0 scale, please submit a ‘Verification of Academic Standing’ written by the International Office Director that states that the student has scored on average or above average in their official grades.</p>
<p>Required Language Proficiency</p>	<p><u>Aoyama Campus</u></p> <p><u>(1) Literature; (2) Education, Psychology & Human Studies(*1); (3) Economics(*1); (4) Law(*1); (5) Business; (6) International Politics, Economics & Communication; and (7) Cultural and Creative Studies</u></p> <p>A) The applicant has studied Japanese for more than one year and have the JLPT N5 or equivalent</p> <p>OR</p> <p>B) Japanese Proficiency is NOT REQUIRED if the applicant will take only English-taught courses. Instead, applicants must have the following English proficiency: <u>TOEFL iBT 68 or IELTS 5.5 or higher</u>, unless they are native English speakers. Health Insurance and Travel Insurance	<p>1) Japanese National Health Insurance (NHI) is compulsory (approx. JPY2,000/m. The amount varies according to the city/ward where the student resides). The student must apply on arrival at the local city/ward office.</p> <p>2) In addition to the above, students must arrange appropriate overseas travel insurance in their home country, which should cover their study period in Japan.</p>
International Commons (at Aoyama Campus)	<p>The “International Commons,” located at Aoyama Campus, has a Chat Room, an English counseling service, as well as a lounge space where international students and local students can get together to talk, play games, etc. Various social and cultural events are also held there.</p> <p>《Special Feature》 Bringing a Global Perspective to University Life at the "International Commons" Aoyama Gakuin University</p>

Tutor (Buddy) System	<p>Student volunteers (mostly local Japanese students) will be assigned to provide peer support for school and day-to-day matters.</p>
