Nomination and Application	<p>Students need to be nominated by their home institution through our nomination and application platform, Mobility-Online. Email nominations are no longer accepted.</p> <p>The link to the platform changes each academic year and will be provided to all partner institutions. 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<i>Late nominations for students not requiring a visa might be accepted after consulting with the International Office.</i>													
Language Requirements (English and/or German)	<p>The expected language proficiency level is B2+ (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages). While a B2+ level is sufficient for admission, a C1 level for modules taught in German is strongly recommended. 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<p>Financial Aid (SEMP)</p>	<p>The Swiss Federal Council provides financial support to students from European partner institutions. Depending on the home institution's country, students can receive a grant of either CHF 1900 or CHF 2200 per semester.</p>

<p>Student Support</p>	<p>Buddy Program:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A local student will be assigned to each incoming student - Whenever possible, the incoming student will be welcomed at the arrival location (Zurich/ Winterthur area) and assisted with transportation to their accommodation - International Officer (local student supporting the International Office) - Support and social events organized by ESN (Erasmus Student Network) 																									

Visa and Health Insurance	
<p>Visa and Residence Permit</p>	<p>Non-EU citizens need a student visa and must apply early (immediately after receiving their letter of acceptance).</p> <p>Students from Australia, Japan, New Zealand, Malaysia, Singapore, and the United Kingdom do <u>not</u> need a visa, but they must apply for an assurance of residence permit (called “<i>Zusicherung der Aufenthaltsbewilligung</i>”) through the SML International Office.</p> <p>All exchange students must apply for a residence permit (L-Permit) upon arrival.</p> <p>Applications for both the visa and residence permit require proof of financial means (minimum of CHF 1,750 monthly).</p> <p>The International Office will provide detailed guidance on the visa or residence permit once the application process is finalized.</p>
<p>Health Insurance</p>	<p>Basic health insurance is mandatory by law in Switzerland and can be obtained after the student’s arrival. Detailed information will be provided during Orientation Week.</p> <p>Non-EU residents must purchase Swiss health insurance (plans starting as low as CHF 61 per month); international health insurance obtained in the student’s home country is usually not sufficient.</p> <p>EU residents with EHIC cards or UK residents with GHIC cards are exempt from this obligation. They need to submit a waiver to the Swiss Healthcare Organization.</p>
