## Semester dates and application procedure

Academic year	The academic year runs from the start of September to the end of June and is divided into semester 1 (Fall) and semester 2 (Spring).  Arrival days, orientation and introduction programme are scheduled during the last 2 weeks of August (semester 1) or the Friday and Saturday before the start of semester 2. 	A confirmation e-mail will be sent to both the nominating institution and the student after the nomination has been checked. The student will be informed about the (online) application procedure by the incoming exchange team.		



Application procedure	All nominated students will receive a link to the online application formafter the nomination deadline.  Students should finalize the online application procedure before:  15 April (semester 1 or full academic year)  15 October (semester 2)			
	Students wishing to participate in courses at Master's degree level need to have finished a Bachelor's degree by the start of their exchange: 1 September for fall semester and 1 February for spring semester. They need to submit proof when applying by means of a (copy of a) Bachelor's degree, or an official statement that the student has obtained 180 ECTS including the bachelor's thesis before the start of the exchange.

# **Recommended language skills**

Language of instruction	Dutch and English
Level of English required for student mobility	The selection of students (undergraduate and graduate level) with sufficient level of English language proficiency (C1 level) is the responsibility of the home university.
Level of English required for teaching staff	C1, TOEFL IBT at least 110, academic IELTS 7.5
Level of Dutch required (for courses in Dutch only)	C1 (advanced level, NT2)  Proof of Dutch language proficiency is mandatory for visiting students who wish to participate in courses taught in Dutch.  Exempted are only students who have completed at least two years of a fully Dutch taught programme no longer than two years prior to the exchange.

Courses	Information about courses and minors available to incoming students can be found on the website and students can search for courses in our exchange study guide.				
	<ul> <li>Restrictions: <ul> <li>Students are generally allowed to choose courses across faculties. However, for advanced courses (level 300 and up), a background in that field of study is required.</li> <li>Bachelor's students are not allowed to follow courses at Master's level.</li> <li>Students who wish to take Dutch-taught courses should reach out to incoming@vu.nl.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>				
Transcript of records	Students have to request their transcript of records themselves as they need to make sure that all their grades have been recorded which takes 2 – 4 weeks after the exam.				
	Transcripts are issued in digital format and without failed courses. If a transcript needs to contain failed courses or needs to be sent directly to the partner university (digitally or as a hard copy), there is a special form that students must fill in.				
	Students are informed about all details on our online learning platform Canvas.				



#### **Grading**

In the Netherlands a ten-point grading scale is used in higher education. 10 is the highest possible grade and 1 is the lowest grade. 6 is the minimum pass grade.

Dutch grade	Explanation
10	Outstanding
9	Excellent
8	Very good
7	Good pass
6	Pass
1 - 5	Fail

A final mark between 5 and 6 will be rounded to the nearest whole number: final marks below 5.5 are rounded down to a 5.0; final marks of 5.5 and higher are rounded up to a passing grade of 6.0.

### **Services**

### Orientation programme

Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam offers international students an introduction programme before the start of each academic semester. The programme consists of social and cultural activities and a Practical Matters Day where students receive information about registration at the municipality, insurance, opening a bank account etc. In addition, student will be introduced to the new academic environment through presentations, workshops and campus tours. Students are strongly advised to attend the introduction programme to ensure a soft landing at VU.

#### **Dutch language courses**

Students can take Dutch language courses at VU Amsterdam. The course <u>Basic Dutch on Campus</u> caters specifically to international students. This 6 ECTS course has a reduced price, and students may count it towards our minimum requirement of 24 ECTS per semester.

Accommodation	We strongly advise students to apply for accommodation through the International Office. Students can only start this process after their exchange application has been approved.  A handling fee of €250 per semester is required for this service. The
	number of rooms available is limited, accommodation cannot be guaranteed and is assigned on a first-paid, first-served base. Rental periods are fixed and cannot be adjusted to the student's arrival and/or departure dates.
	Further information can be found on our website.
	For staff members, accommodation will be arranged through the department they will be visiting.
Visa	Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam will apply for a <u>visa and/or a residence</u> <u>permit</u> on behalf of the exchange student or staff member (if applicable). Students will be informed about the procedure after they complete their application. A handling fee of €275 is required for this service. For staff members, visa and/or a residence permit will be arranged through the department they will be visiting.
Insurance	Health insurance is mandatory for all students and visiting staff.
	EU citizens can apply for an EU Health Insurance Card (EHIC). Non-EU citizens need to arrange their own private health insurance. VU Amsterdam recommends students and visiting staff insurance company AON (though students and visiting staff have the possibility to select their own insurance that will cover their stay in the Netherlands).
