Student Visa	Non-Japanese students must obtain student visa at a Japan consulate on their own responsibility. The University of Osaka-'s Support Office makes a proxy application for a Certificate of Eligibility (CoE, an immigration certification) for students who need a visa after admission offer. Students usually receive their CoE around early September for fall intake and mid-March for spring intake, therefore it is advisable students leave in mid-September for September intake and end-March for April intake, or book a flexible ticket. Student's CoE document will be sent only via email.
